These award-winning communities have demonstrated proven success in using the Main Street Four Point Approach to create economic vitality, a unique sense of place, and a strong commitment to the community by all stakeholders.

Downtown Beloit hosts more than 50 days of events a year from a summer lunchtime concert series to an ArtWalk featuring more than 100 artists. June through October, the Saturday morning Farmers Market draws more than 90 vendors and was named the best event in Wisconsin Main Street history in 2008. Beloit's commitment to local food is evident in a new grocery store. Bushel & Peck's Local Market, housed in the restored Woolworth Building. The market anchors a downtown filled with more than a dozen home-grown restaurants and cafes, boutiques and bookstores, live theater, museums and art galleries, as well as riverfront sculpture and murals. From Blues to Jazz, live music can be found almost every night of the week.

The City of Beloit's beginnings are rooted in its downtown, originally settled by French fur trader Joseph Thibeau in 1824. It grew as a hub of industry along the Rock River and was the center of activity for Beloit. After an all too familiar story of decline and neglect, Downtown Beloit harnessed the passion of its citizens. With innovative, successful partnerships they generated great success in transforming areas of neglect into exemplary examples that a passionate, common vision can achieve. Beloit is regarded as one of the strongest and most sophisticated Main Street programs in Wisconsin. In Beloit you can see this success in their restored riverfront, riverwalk bike paths along with restored buildings and creative new development projects.

The City of Beloit covers approximately 17 square miles. It is home to 37,110 residents as well as more than 88 industrial firms, 850 retail establishments, several corporate headquarters, a minor league baseball team, several museums and an internationally acclaimed college that bears the community's name.

Beloit is rich with breathtaking scenery, exciting attractions, convenient recreational facilities, and year-round events. Whether you're interested in fishing and boating on the Rock River, watching the Snappers play exciting Class-A minor league baseball at Telfer Park, ice skating at Edwards Ice Arena, or partaking in the world horseshoe championship. Beloit has a facility to fit the needs of any sports enthusiast. The Beloit Snappers minor league baseball team is a Class A affiliate of the Oakland A's. They play at Pohlman field which holds about 3,500 people.

Friends of RiverFront is a non-profit organization comprised of a broad-based group of volunteers who share a common passion for enhancing and celebrating community living along Beloit's award-winning riverfront. They are committed to animating and sustaining our spaces along the Rock River.

About the WDAC

In 1982, a small group of business, professional and community leaders formed the Wisconsin Downtown Action Council to address the serious problems plaguing the state's downtowns. Once the hub and heart of their communities, by the early 1980's Wisconsin downtowns were deteriorating. Commercial districts, no longer the center of commerce, were becoming wastelands of vacant stores and shabby buildings. Something had to be done.

Dedicated individuals organized workshops and seminars, where state and national experts would advise communities on how to market, manage and revitalize their downtowns. WDAC was instrumental in spearheading legislation to create Business Improvement Districts (BIDs), one important factor in Wisconsin's success stories: today there are over eighty BIDs in Wisconsin, managing and rebuilding downtowns.

Along with state legislators, WDAC was also a key player in the development of the Wisconsin Main Street Program, an initiative providing technical assistance to downtowns. This is one of the most successful state programs in the country, currently assisting more than thirty communities.

WDAC avidly supports effective and sensible community planning that leads to revitalized downtown areas. WDAC champions downtown as a key component of smart growth; educates on the benefits of downtown; works to identify and remove barriers to downtown development; and coordinates with other organizations to promote smart growth for downtowns.

WDAC continues to evolve, aided recently by strategic planning assistance from UW-Extension. We have re-evaluated who we are, who we serve and our capacity for providing assistance. We are confident in our mission and we look forward to putting our plans into action. We invite you to join us!
