A. **Historic Restoration**: Visit four sites that have evolved to remain essential pieces of the downtown landscape including the Landmark (hotel to affordable housing conversion and restoration), Federal Lofts (federal courthouse and jail to affordable housing conversion), The Grand Theater (historic restoration and preservation) and the Wausau Chamber of Commerce (train depot conversion).

B. Riverfront Development: This tour, led by City of Wausau City Planner Brad Lenz, focuses on the importance of the River across a variety of evolutionary fronts. Highlights will include: Riverlife apartments (first residential development on the riverfront), Native plantings, daylighting Stenchfield Creek, and water management in development, Wausau on the Water (WOW) – first and only (so far) restaurant and bar on the riverfront and Briq's ice cream kiosk (City built, leased space for riverfront amenity) and playground.

NOTE: Both tours will culminate at the Imaginarium – the newest addition to Wausau's downtown fabric and a big economic driver that bridges the past and future of Wausau and Marathon County.
